From the Pastor's Desk

"Prayer is Dangerous"

"Whenever there is prayer, there is danger of His own immediate action." -Screwtape

During the Second World War, in a publication known as The Guardian, a series of letters appeared, written by a senior devil, who was also the undersecretary of a department of Hell, to his nephew and understudy, Wormwood. Not everyone realized that they were a tongue-in-cheek glimpse into salvation and discipleship from the point of view of two devils charged with preventing a commitment to Jesus. C.S. Lewis, who penned "The Screwtape Letters," took some heat for the articles and the little book which resulted. Since then, however, his insights have been appreciated by many.


In Letter IV, Screwtape takes up the topic of prayer with his not-so-bright nephew and makes the comment which appears in the quote above. The danger in prayer, as far as the underworld is concerned, is that God might act, and do it right away. If you read the Gospel of Mark, you will see that God does act, and often right away. The word "immediately" shows up seventeen times in fourteen chapters.

At the recent Pastor and Spouse retreat in Cohasset,I asked a colleague to pray for a pain I was experiencing. Dan has had great success in praying for the healing of others and often is told by the Holy Spirit what is wrong with someone (although the person usually needs to come forward and say, "Yes, that is me".) As Dan prayed, he asked me if I felt any better yet. I thought, "What? Already?" He expected something to happen right away, which made me realize, I could expect something right away too.

God does not always act so quickly. Sometimes other things need to happen first in us, in another person, in the circumstances. But prayer kicks it off. Every prayer kicks off something. Every prayer endangers the schemes of the devils and messes with the realm below. Which is an excellent reason to pray. With the eyes of faith, we "see" the chaos and consternation among the minions of the Adversary. Satan's strategy, then, is to distract us from praying, or dilute our praying, or steer us into the belief that we are not effective when we pray. But we are effective, as almost every Christian can attest. Right away or later, God acts in response to the prayers of His children. Every prayer is answered in some way.

One other thought from Lewis. We often think of Satan as God's rival. Lewis says that is not right. God has no rival. Satan, a created being, is more properly the counterpart of the archangel Michael. In Revelation 12 we can read how Satan loses the contest between the two of them. Remembering this may encourage us to pray more and see more "winning" answers. And in case you were wondering, Screwtape and Wormwood happily [for the Christian world] fail in their mission to prevent faith in their "patient."

Prayer is dangerous. More for the other side than for ours. PS

Colin Welch, our missionary to France

Colin started French language school in September. Please pray for him as he learns the language and makes connections with artists and churches in Paris. They have a new group of six that will be part of the team. Pray for good bonding between them.

A note from Colin: The French church is hungry for growth, revival, and change. Jesus is often associated with religion and religion is seen as taboo. There is a great cultural faux pas in speaking of religion due to the history, laws, and current spiritual climate. Yet, that has not stopped the people of God in France. The French Christians I have met here are some of the most zealous and eager followers of Christ. Though their numbers are small, with only 1.2% of the population claiming to be evangelical, they are fervently praying for a spiritual revival in this land, and are working tirelessly to pursue the Father and His leading.

The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Before I arrived, I was told that France has been nicknamed "the graveyard for missions." As I continue to dive deeper into the culture, meet new people, and further invest in life and ministry, I am struck with the reality of this statement. There are not many people who have come to share the good news. In fact, there are even fewer people here to specifically minister to the French, often seeing more fruit when ministering to expats and immigrant people groups. This has left a huge void in ministry to the French, and I continually meet local pastors who are desperate to find more people willing to work alongside them.

Ben & Jeanette Gerth, our missionaries to Tanzania

Please pray for Ben & Jeanette and their family. Ben continues to do translation work with two language teams in Tanzania: the Ngoreme and the Isenye. Pray for continued success in translating the New Testament in these languages.

- Over MEA Weekend we took 10 students to Bluewater Bible Camp to connect with 9 other Covenant church youth groups for a fall retreat. It was a great time to be with other teenagers who all want to grow deeper in their faith.

It will be for any student currently in 8th—12th grade. Our Northwest Conference will be going to Bowling Green University in Ohio. I am hoping to have a parent meeting in November to start the process of registration and fundraising.
