She was standing on a dock and a school of sunfish was watching the proceedings with great anticipation. These particular sunfish were adept at stealing the bait.

On the other channel from their studio in Odessa, Olga hosts a mid-afternoon air shift on the Ukrainian station.

NLR has to tread carefully in how they advertise, due to continuing Ukrainian government laws that restrict Russian language media. It is a difficult time to be a broadcaster offering two languages in this wartime environment.

Their HOTBIRD satellite channel covers Europe to Western Siberia, giving them signal coverage in tens of thousands of communities that governments can't stop! Any free to air receiver can listen in 24/7!

NLR started its ministry in Russia as that nation's first Christian FM radio station in 1996. Today, 98% of cities in Russia have no local evangelical Christian radio station. Satellite and Internet give them the means to penetrate Russia in 2023. 97% of settlements in Ukraine have no local Christian FM station.

When bombing by Russian forces create power outages, NLR uses an emergency generator to power the studios. Odessa automatically switches over the network control to their remote studio in Austria.

Please pray for KICY and New Life Radio as they continue to spread God's word and encouragement to so many people across a vast area of the world!

### KICY the Covenant radio station in Alaska & Christian Radio for Russia



This is an image showing the rough approximation of our signal into the Russian Far East. The Pastor in Provideniya receives many calls about the positive impact KICY is having on their lives. God's Word prevails.

Since KICY first signed-on Easter Sunday, April 17 of 1960, KICY has continued to broadcast the good news of Jesus Christ throughout Western Alaska and the Russian Far East. They have increased their power to 50,000 watts, 24 hours a day which al-

lows KICY AM 850 the opportunity to send the gospel into some places where other forms of media are not readily available. They operate two distinct radio stations, KICY AM-850 & ICY 100.3 FM. While the AM station broadcasts at 50,000 watts and can be heard throughout the entire region, their FM station is programmed for and serves the City of Nome and surrounding communities.

KICY is located in Nome, Alaska. One of the highlights from their last newsletter was the Iditarod 51 that finished in Nome. It began in Willow with 34 teams taking the trail. Ryan Redington crossed under the burled arch in Nome first, bringing the trophy bearing the image of his grandfather, one of the original organizers of the race, home to the Redington family for the first time.

KICY's coverage of the race was extensive. They set up their scaffold at the arch in front of the Covenant Church welcoming in each finisher. They hosted post-race interviews with several mushers, including the top three. Because of some glitches with other major radio stations, KICY was the only live coverage of "The Last Great Race" that had a reach beyond Nome. KICY has covered each Iditarod Nome finish since the very first one!

#### Christian Radio for Russia and Ukraine

New Life Radio is now operating in two languages. The station manager Ivan Zhurakovski hosts the daily music request and greeting hour which serves to bridge listeners in Russia, Ukraine, and Belarus. He reminds them to send in their requests. One request came from Mariupol, a bombed out city, another from a man on his way to Bakhmut to deliver supplies to needy residents and asking for prayer as he puts his life on the line.

It's a mix and match of Christian unity expressed by music; reaffirming their loyalty to the Lord despite diverse geographic and national identities; and reminders from the Scriptures on how to live the Christian life on a daily basis.
