"IF YOU FIND YOURSELF A QUART LOW..."



One of the great pleasures in life for some of us is the marvelous elixir which comes from the coffee bean. My father-in-law liked to tell the story of its discovery, which upon research proves to be true, and involves some goats in the 9th century who munched the beans from a coffee bush in Ethiopia and then behaved in quite an animated way, to the wonder of their shepherds. Who then tried the beans for themselves.

Coffee is an acquired taste being bitter by nature, and I would never have started to like it, except that we had a coffee break in seminary after our first class,

and the campus kitchen sent over the most amazing doughnuts. Great for dunking in coffee. I liked the doughnuts, and soon I liked the coffee too.

Which brings me to the observation that some people like coffee so well that they are always "a quart low." They can drink it all day, and often carry with them thermal mugs, or if they are connoisseurs, legitimate thermoses.

Knowing this, the Adult Ministry Team has offered to the community, during the colder months a Saturday morning coffee and doughnut time. With the added incentive of cribbage. Certainly, it is a nice gesture. But there is a deeper purpose. There is an OPEN DOOR for us, if we care to walk through it. Fellowship times like these provide opportunities to interact with people who may not come to a church service but may be willing to talk about spiritual things in a relaxed setting. Not only are some people "a quart low" in coffee; they may also be a quart low in the Holy Spirit, who longs to fill them with Himself and transform them. Not to make them more animated, but to give them genuine life through faith in Jesus to Whom the Spirit points.

We need not be experts in the Bible to have spiritual conversations, although there are some good helps in this direction from the FAITH BUILDERS pamphlet and the DISCIPLESHIP COURSE. We just need to be able to tell our own story of meeting Jesus, or of how our life has changed over time because of placing confidence in Him. In the DISCIPLESHIP COURSE we learn to do this in two minutes, which is enough time to make a difference in someone's life.

Coffee and doughnuts, for people a quart low...one way to have meaningful conversations with people who need Jesus. The community garden is another way. I have been thinking about an art gallery. Others have suggested a front porch music jam. Perhaps you can think of a way too...

Jamaica Update

Jamaica 2023



This winter Community Covenant Church sent Steve & Cyd Woller and Dave & Linda Piasecki down to Jamaica to continue our partnership with ministries that began 20+ years ago. In Kingston we helped with a JaBode build for a young woman with 3 children who lost her home to fire. Although she lives in a community with high poverty she has every

desire to provide a safe place to care for her children. Through Jamaica Missions she now has 4 secure walls and a roof on her home that is 16x21 feet, giving her an opportunity to help her family be safe.

Our evenings were spent reconnecting with 5 young men from the orphanage where we used to serve until it closed. Each young man shared

their desires to succeed, improve their skills, provide for their families and the challenges they face. Each are grateful for the opportunities that teams over the years have given them to learn and feel cared for.

In Spring Village, we helped work on finishing a Midwife Center. Mothers desire to carry a baby to full term and have a healthy delivery with a healthy baby. Frequently their only option is an unsanitary clinic

or a home birth without water or electricity which makes having a healthy baby much more challenging. Dr. Gail has taken a shipping container, and with the help of mission teams, turned


it into a birthing center with running water and electricity. She hopes to give midwives an opportunity to become certified and mothers the opportunity to deliver in a safe setting.

Children have a desire to explore, learn and be creative, we provided some opportunities. In typical classrooms of 30+ students, those with learning challenges are easily left behind.

Cyd and Linda were able to work with 3 small groups of struggling readers who tried hard and felt joy at little successes

they had with our "simplified" lessons. The team was also able to provide some funds to help get some of those children evaluated

for their learning needs.
